Sermon Discussion Guide

Series: "What Matters" - Week 8: Parenting

Recap the Highlights:

Parenting Matters

- Parent-Centered families are a priority in today's culture.
- Understand the role of parenting through God's created order.
- Understand the role of <u>authority</u> in our child's development.
- Understand the role of discipline and instruction.
- Parent in a world where children are not in the power position.

Kid's need to know:

- They are loved unconditionally.
- Where they fit into the family.
- That they are not equal to mom and dad.
- Their parents love each other.
- They are not ours, but God's— parents are the stewards.

Now Dig Deeper:

1. "The purpose of instruction is to develop their character rather than change their behavior." How does understanding this change they way to look at parenting in the various stages?

Stage #1: Loving Discipline (ages 1-5) - "Model"

The purpose at the discipline stage is to teach that actions have consequences, both good and bad. Discipline out of love not anger with consistent boundaries.

Stage #2: Training (ages 5-12) - "Guide"

The purpose at the training stage is to nurture a love for God and others in the hearts of our kids. Make the Emotional investment.



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Stage #3: Coaching (age 13-18) "Mentor"

The purpose at the coaching stage is to release your kids to establish their own biblical convictions and apply them

Stage #4: Friendship (ages 18/20+) - <u>"Encourager and champion"</u>
The purpose at the friendship stage is to release your kids to be mature, responsible adults. They need to hear the truth, the stories, and the values that matter.

2. Dig into some of the scriptures discussed in the message this week and allow them to nourish the soil of your hearts on parenting.
