WHAT TO BRING:

- A good attitude, a teachable spirit, and a hunger for God to do great things!
- One small-medium overnight bag
- Bible, notebook, and pen – Note Takers are History Makers!
- Bedding – pillow, sheets (twin) and a blanket or sleeping bag.
- Bathroom items and toiletries – towels, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, soap, deodorant, etc.
- Clothes – Please bring recreational clothing for outside activities and casual clothing.
- We will be OUTSIDE - Bring a jacket in case of low temperatures, as well as a rain jacket in case of rain.

WHAT NOT TO BRING:

- Anything that will distract you from God’s presence and others.
- Phones into sessions of teaching, worship, and prayer. We will have a cell phone check-in to start each session.

LODGING:

- Students will lodge with other students of the same sex.
- Students will sleep in individual twin-sized bunk beds.
- Students will room in cabins ranging from 6-15 twin-sized beds.
- There will be multiple leaders of the same sex as chaperones in the cabins.
